



Roman Missal Supplement for Anointed in the Spirit Candidate Handbook

The *Roman Missal* is the ritual text used in the Catholic Church that contains prayers and instructions for the celebration of the Mass. A new *Roman Missal* (Third Edition) will be implemented in the United States on the First Sunday of Advent, November 27, 2011. This supplement will help you prepare for and learn certain prayers and the new Parts of the Mass found in this handbook.

Apostles' Creed (see pages 50, 127-128)

I believe in God, the Father almighty,
Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus
Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was con-
ceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin
Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was cruci-
fied, died and was buried; he descended into
hell; on the third day he rose again from the
dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated
at the right hand of God the Father almighty;
from there he will come to judge the living and
the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic
Church, the communion of saints, the forgive-
ness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and
life everlasting. Amen.

Nicene Creed (see pages 132-133)

I believe in one God, the Father almighty,
maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible
and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only
Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before
all ages. God from God, Light from Light,
true God from true God, begotten, not made,
consubstantial with the Father; through him all
things were made. For us men and for our sal-
vation he came down from heaven, and by the
Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary,
and became man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius
Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and
rose again on the third day in accordance with
the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is
seated at the right hand of the Father. He will



come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.
