- **4.** Why is the truth that Jesus, the Second Person of the Trinity, actually became one of us so important? Give a detailed answer, describing how Jesus is truly one of us.
- **5.** Describe a passage from one of the Gospels in which Jesus' humanity is evident.
- **6.** Why do you think there has been a tendency in Christian history to focus more on the divinity of Jesus than on his humanity?
- 7. Describe a passage from one of the Gospels in which Jesus' divinity is evident.
- The names for the second Person of the Trinity in the Gospels all tell us something about Jesus' divinity. Explain what each of the following names tells us: (a) Jesus Christ, (b) Son of God, (c) Lord.
- 9. What is the term used to describe the mystery of our faith that God became man?
- **10.** Why is Mary, Jesus' mother, such an important part of the mystery of God becoming man?
- **11.** If God really became one of us and continues to remain with us through the power of the Holy Spirit, why is life still often so difficult and confusing?
- 12. Where do you think we should be looking for the face of Jesus today?
