

Module 6 Summative Assessment Project

In this module, we learned about what it means to follow Christ through the Catholic moral tradition.

We all long for inspirational stories of agape in action to point us in the right direction—toward God and lasting happiness.

Now you are going to work in groups to create and present an original story. The story will be about a group of people your age who live out several tenets of the Catholic moral tradition. The story will show how to overcome temptation and sin by sharing God's agape love.

Objective

Work together to create and present a realistic story about inspiring teens who are making a difference for the common good.

Content

1. Select your scenario from these options:
 - a. a series of daily journal, diary, or blog entries with photos created by teens while serving on a mission trip
 - b. scenes from a documentary about a group of teens who are making life better for a specific group of people suffering from a modern injustice
 - c. a news interview with a group of teens who have started a social justice or charitable organization
 - d. a movie script about teens who have become famous because they inspired others with their unique approach to a social injustice
 - e. a public service announcement that features teens bringing attention to a serious injustice that affects many people
 - f. an original song or poem (sung or spoken aloud) that tells the story of teens who acted justly in an unfair situation
2. Select your presentation format from these options:
 - a. slideshow
 - b. video footage
 - c. animation
 - d. live skit or performance
3. Include realistic situations to represent the teens living out each of these 10 tenets of the Catholic moral tradition:
 - a. a Cardinal Virtue
 - b. a Theological Virtue
 - c. a gift of the Holy Spirit
 - d. a Beatitude
 - e. one of the Ten Commandments
 - f. a Corporal Work of Mercy



- g. a Spiritual Work of Mercy
 - h. a Catholic social teaching principle
 - i. overcoming personal temptation caused by one of the seven deadly sins
 - j. working to overcome a social sin
4. Present your story to the class.

Presentation Quality

1. Each person's involvement in the presentation is between 2 and 2 1/2 minutes. The entire presentation should not exceed 8 minutes.
2. The presentation is original and well organized.
3. Each presenter has good posture, makes eye contact, speaks clearly, and is not chewing gum.
4. The language, sounds, and images used are not offensive and do not violate school policies.
5. The presentation informs the class about a modern social injustice.
6. The presentation helps the class recognize the tenets of the Catholic moral tradition in action.
7. The presentation inspires the class to see possible ways to live out agape and make a difference for the common good.

Group Cooperation

1. Throughout the preparation process, the group members work well together to resolve disagreements and agree on all presentation parts.
2. The group members divide responsibilities fairly.
3. The group members support one another.
4. Each presenter follows through with responsibilities and is prepared.
5. Each group member presents a fair portion of the material prepared.
