8. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

9. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife.

Be happy with the friendships you have, and give praise to God for them. Do not envy the relationships that others have.

10. You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.

God has given you great gifts to be used for your good and the good of others. Do not be angry with others that they have what you do not have.
