<b>Introductory Rites</b>	Gathering of the Assembly	Every Eucharist begins with the gathering of the assembly. Christ himself is the head of the assembly, and the bishop or priest acts in his name. At a Sunday liturgy there is often an opening hymn.
	Penitential Act	A prayer or litaney that acknowledges the mercy of Christ and his role in our salvation.

<p><b>Liturgy of the Word</b></p>		<p>A Scripture reading that draws us to the roots of our faith. Generally taken from the Old Testament, this reading is coordinated with the Gospel Reading.</p>

	<p>Profession of Faith / Universal Prayer (Prayer of the Faithful)</p>	<p>The Nicene Creed is recited as a response to the Word of God, and as a way for the assembly to proclaim as one, "I believe!" This is followed by the Prayer of the Faithful, or intercessory prayers for the Pope, bishop, world, parish, and for other needs.</p>
