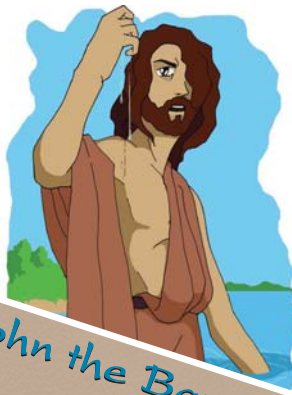




Jesus the Christ

- † Through his suffering, death, and Resurrection, he opened the gates of heaven.

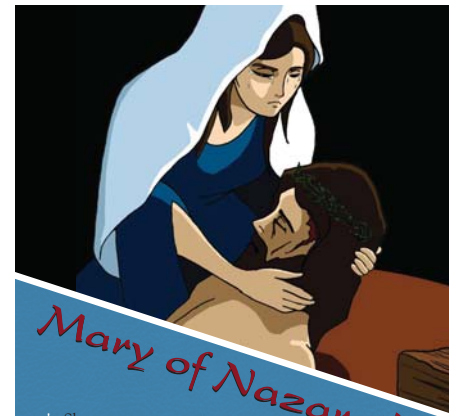
