

## Cases to Examine: Self-respect

Read the following cases. Decide whether the main character's response to the situation expresses self-respect or a lack of self-respect and put a check mark in the appropriate space. In writing, suggest how you would change a response that shows a lack of self-respect to a self-respecting one.

## Case 1: Jana

Jana signed up for the advanced-track chemistry section because she thought it would better prepare her for the premed college program she wants. When the schedule comes out, she learns she has been placed in the regular-track section. "Guess they didn't think I was smart enough," she says to herself, and resentfully goes off to the assigned section.

On Mike's second day at the high school, before the start of a class, he overhears one student muttering to another, while looking directly at Mike, "Once they let the dirtballs in, the whole place goes downhill." Mike's face burns, but he just tries to pretend he didn't hear.

Friday after school, one of Greg's friends approaches him with a request: "I'm desperate, man. I've got to get a ride tonight out to Midvale [an hour's drive] to pick up these concert tickets for me and Heather, or the guy's gonna sell them to someone else. You are my last hope."

Greg, remembering a favor this friend did for him last week, answers, "Sure, I got nothing else to do tonight."
