You may be interested in Pope Francis's favorite image of the Church, and his understanding of God's relationship with us as revealed in the image of "People of God":

The image of the Church I like is of the holy, faithful people of God. This is the definition I often use, and then there is that image from the Second Vatican Council's 'Dogmatic Constitution on the Church' (No. 12). Belonging to a people has a strong theological value. In the history of salvation, God has saved a people. There is no full identity without belonging to a people. No one is saved alone, as an isolated individual.
