6.	Now turn to the Book of Jonah. What does God want Jonah to do (see 1:1–2)?
7.	How does Jonah respond to God (see Jonah 1:3)?
8.	How does God answer Jonah? What does God do to help (see Jonah 1:17, 2:10)?
9.	What does Jonah finally do, with God's help (see Jonah 3:3–4)?
10.	What did Jonah need in order to say "yes"?
11.	Turn to Acts of the Apostles 9:1–19. What does God want Saul to do (see Acts 9:3–4,15)?
